The annual **Azalea Festival Symposium**, hosted by **Allied Command Transformation and Old Dominion University**, in conjunction with the 2009 Azalea Festival's most honored nation, the Czech Republic, will bring together policy makers, academics, and military officers from both sides of the Atlantic to explore how the Alliance, using tools of persuasion and inspiration, will help build a stable and peaceful international order in the 21st century. In addition to the planned keynote speeches, the conference will feature panel discussions in key areas such as the new security paradigm, improved cooperation with the EU and UN, and the expanding dimensions of transatlantic security. The conference will take place **30 April 2009** at the **Ted Constant Convocation Center**.

## From the Library

The library now has access to two more interesting databases: First, the **Foreign Broadcast Information Service (FBIS) Daily Reports 1974-1996** contains transcripts of foreign broadcasts and news, translated into English. Many of these materials are first-hand reports of events as they occurred. As such, the FBIS Daily Reports provide a unique historical archive essential for international studies, political science and world history. The second, **Slavery, Abolition & Social Justice, 1490-2007** provides a portal for slavery and abolition studies, bringing together documents and collections covering an extensive time period 1490-2007, from libraries and archives across the Atlantic world. Close attention is being given to the varieties of slavery, the legacy of slavery, the social justice perspective and the continued existence of slavery today. The School of Humanities and Social Sciences at Al Akhawayn University in Ifrane has one new opening in International Relations/American Studies/Political Science, to begin in Fall 2009. The candidate will teach undergraduate and graduate courses on U.S. history, society, and government, in addition to basic undergraduate classes in Comparative Political Systems. Other courses include American Foreign Policy in the Middle East and North Africa, and US-European Relations. Applicants must have a PhD at time of hire. Teaching experience is desirable, but newly graduated PhDs are encouraged to apply. All teaching is conducted in English, and a working knowledge of French and/or Arabic is recommended. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled.

THE UNIVERSITY: Al Akhawayn University is a private English-language university in Morocco built on the American model of higher education. The university is composed of approximately 1,300 undergraduate and master's level students in a residential campus environment. The main campus of the university is located in Ifrane, a resort town in the Middle Atlas Mountains approximately 60km from the Imperial cities of Fez and Meknes. The university also has a campus center in the commercial center of Casablanca with a focus on professional and executive programs. There are approximately 100 academic faculty members; about 50% of whom are international.
