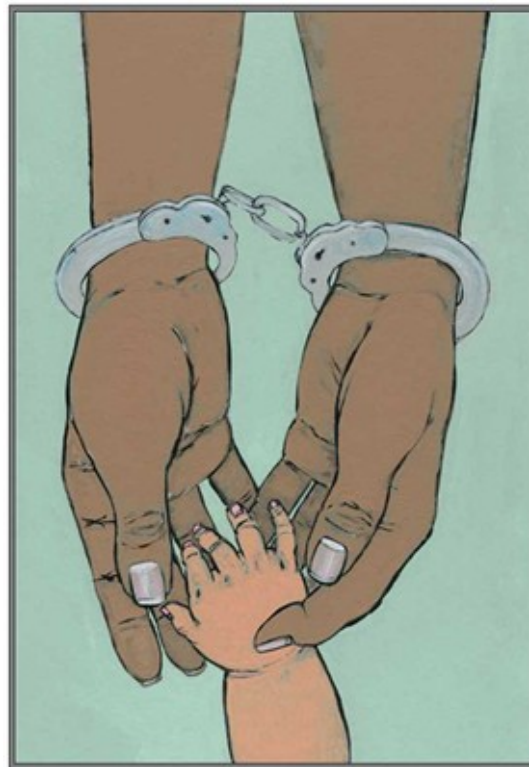

This conversation will draw from her celebrated ODU exhibit, **Interrupted Life: Experiences of Incarcerated Mothers in the U.S.**, which will reach over 135 US college and university galleries.
